## FELC Engage Page: April 7, 2019—Lent 5: Grace

**John 12:1-8** *Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."*

Sun, Apr. 7: Family Project: Have you ever tried to do something helpful only to find out that your actions were misinterpreted? Have you had your motives questioned by others? When Mary anoints Jesus' feet with costly perfume, Judas begins to question the act. Since these words were after the fact, they could no longer advise but could only bring shame and hurt. Talk about times that your actions have been questioned or your motives misinterpreted. How do you learn from those situations? Discuss how you can state your opinion in ways that bring understanding rather than shame. How do you advise without building up walls of resentment?

Mon, Apr. 8: Judas does not seem very happy. He is compelled to point out the shortcomings in Mary's actions when she anoints Jesus' feet with expensive perfume. He reminds me of the older brother in the parable of the prodigal son who judges his father's generosity and is unable to join the homecoming party. We are tempted to scoff at the extravagance of others, thinking, "That money could have been better spent by ..." Instead, let us respond with joy whenever we see people moved to generous living.

Tues, Apr. 9: Letting resentment take hold of our lives can have disastrous effects on our physical and psychological well-being. When the Chief Priests and Pharisees give full reign to their self-righteousness, they take action to have Jesus killed. They convince themselves that this is the best course of action so that the Jews don't suffer the retribution of the Romans. They are able to convince themselves that the ends justify the means. Pray that God would help you discern self-centered motives for actions you believe are for a greater good. Pray for protection from self-deception.

Wed., Apr. 10, Isaiah 43:1-13 Relentless. As we have been studying the parable of the prodigal son this Lent, we have been reminded over and over again of the relentless love of God. This is the sort of love the Lord speaks of in Isaiah 43:2. *"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you."* It's hard for us to understand this sort of love. If people wrong us more than once, we keep our distance. This is the sort of love that pushes us beyond fear. Of rejection. Pray that you grow accustomed to resting in the love of God, and let that love feed you so you are able to offer love and forgiveness to others.

Thurs, Apr. 11, Psalm 31:9-16 *"Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress."* (v. 9) Most of us can remember times when we feel deep distress and isolation. A sense of loneliness can take root and make us feel forgotten or even disliked. The psalmist described being scorned, avoided, and an object of dread—a broken vessel. If we feel this way, like this psalmist, we know that we can be honest before God. In contrast to the darkness of spirit described, the request is spoken for God's face to shine on the psalmist. When depression and darkness persist, it is important to reach out to a counselor or pastor. As you seek help, visualize the light of God's face shining on you, bringing hope to all the dark places.

Fri., Apr. 12, Philippians 2:5-11 As a young bride, I would watch the selfless service of my mother-in-law and think to myself, *"There's no way that I'm going to work like crazy while the men sit around and watch TV."* Social norms were changing, and sometimes my new sensitivity to discrimination could be extremely judgmental. This crossed my mind recently when I was in the kitchen making supper as my husband, sons, and their friends (almost all male) were around the table playing games. What I thought was, *"This is right where I want to be."* Though any sense of expectation would have compelled me to lay down spatula & dishcloth, what I was experiencing was the joy of service. Jesus laid aside the form of God, emptied himself & became a servant. He did not count his rights. I am not promoting going back to the days when women were compelled to serve. Rather we are all invited into Christ's joy as we lay down our rights—and pick up the dishtowel.

Sat, Apr. 13, Luke 23:1-49 Recently three schoolgirls in Burundi were arrested and faced up to five years in prison for scribbling on a picture of their country's president. We are shocked at the disparity between the severity of the "crime" and the possible sentence, and can't help but wonder about the fear that this misdirection of justice might prompt in the people. As I read the accusations against Jesus (*He stirs up the people by teaching throughout all Judea.*), I feel a similar sense of incongruity. The Chief Priests fear they will lose power and position if people continue following Jesus. We also can act unjustly if we feel our security is threatened. May Jesus strengthen us to act courageously and justly, even if our actions bring hardship.
