

## FELC Engage Page: March 10, 2018—Lent 1: Parables

**Luke 15:1-10** Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them." So he told them this parable: "Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance. "Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.' Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Sun, Mar. 10: Family Project: As a person who regularly misplaces keys, it seems as though I am often in the process of looking for something. Share stories of the joy of finding lost items. We also can experience the loss of relationships. How were those relationships mended? Talk about the joy of being found and the wonder of renewed relationships, both with God and with people.

Mon, Mar. 11: John MacArthur writes of the shepherd & lost sheep. "There's an image of compassion and an illustration of divine grace in the way the shepherd "lays it on his shoulders" and brings it home. He doesn't beat or berate the wandering sheep. He doesn't even leave it to the sheep to travel home in his own power. He lifts it up and carries it, and he does so with joy and delight rather than anger or exasperation. In fact, in Jesus' account, the shepherd is so delighted over the return of the sheep that he calls together his friends and neighbors to celebrate." \*Praise God that Jesus rejoices over our homecoming with just such a delight! \*MacArthur, John, *The Prodigal Son* (Nelson Books: 2008) p. 28.

Tues, Mar. 12: MacArthur writes, "If you can hear the parable of the prodigal son and not identify yourself, you are missing the unspoken point of Jesus' message... On the one hand, we see how repentance unleashes heaven's joy. On the other hand, we learn that refusing to see one's own need for repentance is nothing but stubborn, self-righteous opposition to heaven's agenda." (MacArthur, p. 36.) These tough words remind us that having a soft heart—one that regularly repents and liberally forgives—is central to experiencing God's joy.

Wed., Mar. 13, Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18 I am most likely to question the usefulness of prayer when I am deep in sorrow, pain or resentment. I may even question God's willingness to fulfill promises. Abram certainly questioned, but in time, he experienced God's faithfulness to make of his descendants a great nation. As Prof. Rolf Jacobson points out, fulfilling that promise cost something. "The gospel in its most narrow and precise sense is an unconditional promise that requires the death of God. ...This promise ...ultimately led to the very death of the Son of God, Jesus. In order to be faithful to creation, to Abraham and Sarah's descendants, and to the promises to David, the Creator ultimately took on human flesh, walked down the lonely path, and died. He did so that we might have life." [http://www.workingpreacher.org/preaching.aspx?commentary\\_id=4001](http://www.workingpreacher.org/preaching.aspx?commentary_id=4001)

Thurs, Mar. 14, Psalm 27 How does this psalm move from a declaration of trust to a request that God wouldn't cast the writer aside in anger. Prof. Amanda Benckhuysen explains. "Trust does not preclude lament. Confidence in God's ability to overcome the darkest of evils does not require holding back our tears, our disappointments, our deep longing for more of God. Faith does not rule out doubt. Both trust and lament are proper expressions of faith in the context of hardship and suffering and often they go hand in hand. What they share in common is an unwavering conviction in the reality, the goodness, and the power of God, who is both worthy of our confidence but also attentive to our cries for help." [http://www.workingpreacher.org/preaching.aspx?commentary\\_id=3994](http://www.workingpreacher.org/preaching.aspx?commentary_id=3994)

Fri., Mar. 15, Philippians 3:17-4:1 What does it mean to be an enemy of the cross? Enemies of the cross are those who discount Jesus' death, following a path contrary to his teachings. Even though friendly to the powers of the day, "their end is destruction"; falling into self-indulgence, "their god is the belly"; preoccupied with earthly things, they are prideful of power and possessions. Wait—absent from the persecution that grounded these followers of the cross in the hope of heaven, these traits of enemies of the cross can often apply to each of us. Instead of living with earthly values, remember today that your citizenship is in heaven.

Sat, Mar. 16, Luke 15:11-19 The prodigal son becomes almost a caricature of the traits most reviled in his society. Total disregard for his family and for God make him an object of contempt for the listeners. And yet even more odd to the ears of those who had spent lives trying to follow the law was the idea that total forgiveness and acceptance could come before the prodigal had done anything to prove his change of heart. What have you done that brings you far away from your home of faith? How have you distanced yourself from the grace and forgiveness that is yours to experience? Remember, God lovingly awaits your return.
