

Learning Ministry Team Meeting Minutes Tuesday, June 27, 6:00 p.m. North Site Library Meets quarterly

- In lieu of devotions, and being mindful of the 1½ hour ministry team norm, the opening time was used to discuss why religious education is important to each member. This is the first time this group has met.
 - A. There were a mix of motivations and experience including:
 - 1. Wanting to be more involved for a deeper experience at FELC
 - 2. Having a long-time interest and volunteer history in education at FELC
- II. The new ministry team structure was discussed
 - A. Group meets quarterly for big picture visioning, continued learning about new possibilities, identifying targeted tasks for subgroup or task force creation
 - B. Maintaining the central purpose (the arrow) of education at FELC, being:
 - 1. Share the stories of why we are in community
 - 2. Provide tools for families and the congregation to deepen faith practice
 - 3. To intentionally create relationships with Christ and each other
- III. Discussion of the trends in religious education at FELC, the ELCA, and protestant mainline churches at large
 - A. Erratic Sunday School attendance due to cultural shifts in Sunday recreational, extracurricular, and work commitments or family preference means that new, creative ideas and experiments will be part of the future of most congregations looking to maintain religious education as a mission
 - B. Cumulative curriculum is not as effective in our current time as it has been in the past

- C. Teaching Sunday School does not feel as impactful
- D. The FELC Communion Class and Confirmation were lifted up as examples of programs where families responded positively to the information and approach
- E. New experiments that churches are trying were discussed briefly
 - 1. Intergenerational learning
 - 2. Wednesday as the main education and worship night (a shift from Sunday as the primary)
 - 3. Baptismal education and connection to keep families connected in the gap between baptism and religious education
 - 4. Milestone Ministry
- IV. Work for next meeting
 - A. Read Dr. Rev. Rich Melheim's book, "Let's Kill Sunday School (before Sunday School kills the church)" to discuss what may be worth additional consideration and what might not work at FELC
 - B. Each member of the team will make a list of:

 - 3. Wish list for where we want to go
